PERSON-CENTERED MEDICAL HOME PROGRAM QUALITY PERFORMANCE MEASURES

Effective January 1, 2016

Pediatric Quality Measures

- Well-child visits in the first 15 months of life – 6 or more visits
- Well-child visits in the third, fourth, fifth and sixth years of life
- Adolescent well-care visits
- Percentage of eligible beneficiaries ages 2-21 with at least one dental visit during the measurement year. The visit must be with a dentist or dental hygienist.
- Annual percentage of asthma patients (ages 2-20) with one or more asthma-related emergency department visits
- Emergency department usage (excluding mental health and chemical dependency services). The age 0-19 breakout of this measure will be used.
- Developmental screening in the first three years of life. Total of three age ranges will be used.
- Medication Management for People With Asthma – The percentage of patients with persistent asthma who were prescribed and remained on asthma "controller medication" for at least 75% of their treatment period. The age 5-18 breakout of this measure will be used. **(Newly added measure for Calendar Year 2016)**
- Hospital Readmissions - Total readmission rate within 30 days after discharge (behavioral and physical health). The age 0-20 breakout of this measure will be used. **(Newly added measure for Calendar Year 2016)**
- Metabolic Monitoring for Children and Adolescents on Antipsychotics - The percentage of children and adolescents 1-17 years of age who had two or more antipsychotic prescriptions and had metabolic testing. **(Newly added measure for Calendar Year 2016)**

Adult Quality Measures

- Adults ages 18-75 with a diagnosis of Type I or Type II diabetes who received at least one eye screening for diabetic retinal disease in a two year period
- Adults age 18-75 with a diagnosis of Type I or Type II diabetes who received at least one HbA1c screening during the measurement year. **(Newly added measure for Calendar Year 2016)**
- Post-Admission Follow-up: Percentage of adults age 21-75 with an inpatient "medical" or psychiatric admission with a claim for post-admission follow-up with a physician, PA, or APRN within seven days of the inpatient discharge. Medical admissions are defined as all admissions that are not maternity or surgery related.
- Psychiatric Medication Management - Percentage of adults given a new psychiatric diagnoses, and medication, by a PCP who received a follow-up visit within 30 days



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- Hospital Readmissions - Total readmission rate within 30 days after discharge (behavioral and physical health). The age 21-64 breakout of this measure will be used.
- Emergency department usage (excluding mental health and chemical dependency services). The age 20 and above breakout of this measure will be used.
- Medication Management for People With Asthma - Percent of patients with persistent asthma who were prescribed and remained on asthma "controller medication" for at least 75% of their treatment period. The age 19-64 breakout of this measure will be used. **(Newly added measure for Calendar Year 2016)**
