TO: Physicians, Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs), Physician Assistants (PAs) and Certified Nurse Midwives (CNMs)

**RE:** Obstetrics Pay for Performance

The Department of Social Services (DSS) is introducing a fourth cycle for the Pay for Performance (P4P) in obstetrical care program, beginning with claims for dates of service from August 1, 2019 and forward. The purpose of the program for individuals covered under HUSKY Health is to:

- Improve the overall care of pregnant individuals and the outcomes of their newborns
- Decrease the incidence of avoidable maternal mortality and morbidity by encouraging:
  - o Early entry into prenatal care
  - Identification of risk factors contributing to maternal morbidity and mortality
  - Low-dose aspirin prophylaxis for members at high or moderate risk of preeclampsia according to American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) guidelines
  - Self-measured blood pressure for members with hypertension
  - Increased engagement in postpartum and ongoing primary care

Obstetrical P4P payments are in addition to current fee for service payments. Payments will be made annually after allowing for six (6) months of claims run out.

Providers eligible to participate in the obstetric P4P program must currently be enrolled in the Connecticut Medical Assistance Program (CMAP) either as a family medicine physician, obstetrician/gynecologist, obstetric nurse practitioner, family medicine nurse

practitioner, physician assistant, or certified nurse midwife and be providing obstetric care.

To be eligible for P4P payments, obstetrical services must be performed by eligible providers on dates of service from August 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. Only episodes of care for which eligible providers have completed online obstetrics (OB) notification forms will be eligible for the P4P program.

### **P4P Prenatal Performance Measures**

DSS will base P4P payments on the following performance measures (with their associated point values):

Prenatal Measures	Points
Completion of the prenatal online	5
notification form within 14 days of	
the first prenatal visit.	
First prenatal visit and risk	30
identification within 14 days of a	
confirmed pregnancy, where at a	
minimum all of the following have	
occurred:	
1. Maternal risk screening,	
including but not limited to:	
a. Blood pressure	
b. Co-morbidity,	
especially:	
i. Cardio-	
vascular	
disease	
ii. diabetes	
iii. hypertension	
iv. clotting	
disorders	
2. Social determinants of health	
screening

Prenatal Measures	<b>Points</b>
Low-dose aspirin prophylaxis for	25
members at high or moderate risk of	
preeclampsia according to American	
College of Obstetricians and	
Gynecologists (ACOG) guidelines.	
To meet this measure, both of the	
following must have occurred:	
1. A prescription for low-dose	
aspirin was given	
2. Low-dose aspirin was	
prescribed between 12 weeks	
and 28 weeks of gestation	
(optimally before 16 weeks)	
and continued daily until	
delivery	
Self-measured blood pressure (BP)	25
for members with hypertension in	
addition to usual perinatal care visits	
and provider measured BP.	
To meet this measure, a prescription	
for a BP monitoring device must be	
issued.	

## **P4P Postpartum Performance Measures**

Postpartum Measures	Points
Full term (39 weeks gestation),	50
vaginal delivery after	
spontaneous labor.	
Completion of the postpartum	5
online notification forms within	
14 days of the first occurring	
postpartum visit.	
At least one postpartum visit	15
occurring within 21 days of	
delivery.	
A comprehensive postpartum	15
visit occurring between 22 and 84	
days after delivery that addresses	
all of the following:	
<ol> <li>Future pregnancy</li> </ol>	
planning	

P	ostpartum Measures	Points
2.	Contraceptive	
	options/choices	
3.	Ongoing medical	
	conditions	
4.	Behavioral health issues	
5.	Substance use/misuse	

DSS will collect data from claims and the online OB notification forms to determine the provider P4P payments.

#### **Provider P4P Enrollment**

Providers who were enrolled in the third cycle of the P4P will be given access to fourth cycle P4P online notification forms beginning on August 1, 2019.

Providers who were not previously enrolled in the third cycle of the P4P can enroll in the P4P by completing a 2019 obstetric P4P registration form. The registration form can be accessed via HUSKY Health's secure provider portal:

Providers registered in the P4P program can begin submitting obstetric notification forms on August 1, 2019. All online obstetric notification forms must be submitted between August 1, 2019 and July 31, 2020 with service dates occurring August 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 to be eligible for the fourth cycle P4P.
